


REGULATORY FRAMEWORK FOR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT










IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CIVIL PROTECTION STRATEGY


The Civil Protection Strategy of Aragon is a sixphase framework plan that organizes prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery in the event of emergencies, ensuring that all resources (human, material, and financial) are coordinated an available.






ADMINISTRATIVE TOOLS FOR PLANNING MANAGEMENT

Civil protection plans are an essential tool for anticipating, coordinating, and executing emergency responses, ensuring that all actors are aware of their roles, available resources, and protocols for action.



CIVIL PROTECTION ECONOMIC POLITICS

Law 4/2024 provides flexible the budgets and mechanisms to support both prevention (stable funds and programs) and response (extendable loans, emergency hiring, and immediate aid), including a Prevention Fund to support analysis, training, and awareness-raising throughout the country.




EMERGENCY HIRING AS ONE OF THE TOOLS FACE UP TO OF DISASTERS

The data available indicates an upward trend.







REGULATION

Common European regulations

The European framework does not take into account for a specific procedure called "emergency procurement," but foresees exceptions within Directive 2014/24/EU, allowing procurement negotiated without publication in cases of "extreme urgency."

These exceptions require **justification of the cause** of the urgency (unforeseeable events not attributable to the Administration) and avoidance of abuse of the concept.



REGULATION

In Spain processing, no procedure

Mechanism oriented to act immediately in response to "catastrophic events, situations mean serious danger, or emergencies affecting national defense."

Article 120 of the LCSP excludes the obligation to process a procurement file and, therefore, the need to publish the tender notice in subjection only to the formal requirements provided for in ordinary processing.

Publication is limited to the obligation to report emergency processing agreements to the Council of Ministers, in the case of the state level.



Immediate and absolutely necessary action

Enabling cases under the LCSP

Report to the Council of Ministers (or governing authority of the autonomous community, where applicable)

Impossible application of other procedures less restrictive of free competition to ensure the achievement, in a timely manner, of the intended purpose.

The hiring authority expressly recognizes the urgency of the situation

The strictly necessary duration

The cause not attributable to the hiring authority



IRREGULARITIES DETECTED BY ICEX

2024 COURT OF AUDITORS REPORTS ON EMERGENCY HIRING DERIVED FROM COVID

The object of the emergency contracts was directly or indirectly linked to the adoption of measures to protect against the spread of COVID-19, except in some cases where no such link was apparent or the justification for the emergency suffer from defects.

In the **preparation of contracts**, 7% of those audited showed a certain lack of clarity regarding the services that constituted their subject matter. In 22% of cases, the execution period was not expressly determined or was set in a flexible or imprecise manner.

In **execution**, 9% of the contracts audited failed to comply with the legally established one-month deadline for commencement, or the date of commencement was not verified.



IRREGULARITIES DETECTED BY ICEX

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COURT OF AUDITORS OF SPAIN

- **Prepare a file** containing all the necessary documents to justify the emergency and the needs that motivate the contract.
- Formalize contracts in a written document, detailing specific services to ensure compliance.
- Appoint a contract manager, in accordance with Article 62.1 of the LCSP.
- Verify the technical **capacity and financial solvency** of the successful bidders, except in cases where this compromises the urgency.
- Request bids from multiple bidders and negotiate terms, provided that this is compatible with the emergency.
- Conduct detailed audits of emergency contracts, including information on contractors, goods purchased, and justification for the exceptional procedure and the needs to be met.
- Obtain references for the market prices of the goods and services contracted.



SPECIAL REPORTS ON THE SUPERVISION OF CONTRACTS PROCESSED BY EMERGENCY PROCEDURE OIReScon

Confusion between "type of procedure" and "type of processing." Emergency processing is not covered by European directives and is a residual regulatory legacy of our legal system.

Greater **transparency** in the decisions adopted by governing bodies, indicating at least the amount, the successful bidders, and the contracts awarded to their own resources.

Uniform advertising parameters are recommended in all autonomous communities and in the General State Administration.
